NY Area's Largest Privately Held Companies

Ranked by projected 2005 revenues

This list of 200 top privately held companies in the New York area is based on published sources that include *Crain's*, *Forbes*, *Dun's Regional Business Directory*, *Hoover's* and *Long Island Business News*.

Given the confidential nature of the information for many privately held companies, it is not possible to identify and include every firm that would qualify for the list, although *Crain's* makes every effort to do so.

For the same reason, all data should be considered estimates.

Companies based in New York City and Nassau, Suffolk and Westchester counties in New York and in Bergen, Essex, Hudson and Union counties in New Jersey are eligible for the list. Nonprofit organizations, hospitals, mutual companies, travel agencies and partnerships—including accounting firms, law firms and

consulting firms—are excluded.

Companies contacted for this list were given several opportunities to submit or verify entries. The footnotes on *Crain's* estimates indicate cases in which information did not come directly from the company and is published as it appeared elsewhere. In some cases, *Crain's* estimates for 2005 revenues and for number of employees are based on data from 2004. Compa-

nies that submitted or verified their information directly are not footnoted.

When companies have equal projected 2005 revenues, they are ranked alphabetically.

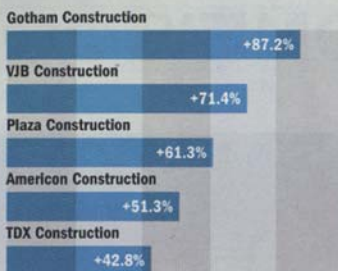
BUILDING INDUSTRY PREPS FOR CONCRETE GAINS

THE CRAIN'S RANKING of the area's largest construction companies shows a few firms moving up or down the list, but the sector that it spotlights is rock-solid.

Residential housing continues to boom. Office construction, which saw a slight lull as several major projects were finished, is gearing up for more activity in the next year. In fact, construction levels in 2006 could surpass those of 2000. Work is slated to continue on the Freedom Tower and the downtown transportation hub, and the conversion of the Farley Post Office—site of the new Moynihan train station—will begin.

Projected % change in NY area revenues, 2004-2005



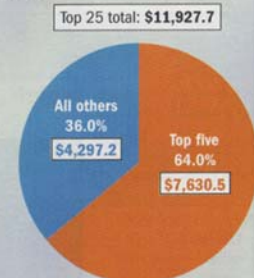
Top Six Companies
